TEACHING CONTENT COURSES IN ENGLISH USING CLIL

The CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) method allows a professor to teach language and content simultaneously which maximizes the instructional time in the classroom with students, and students acquire language often without realizing it as they focus primarily on the academic course content. The concept of Motivation and Leadership in Language Learning is included to provide strategies to motivate students to acquire and perfect their new language as they apply it to real world situations.

This seminar provides participants with strategies for communicating with international partners in the English language. The seminar includes components on cultural backgrounds, similarities, and differences; assumptions; direct vs. implied language (e.g. spoken vs. unspoken information); formal and informal registers; non-verbal communication; electronic vs. in-person communication; skills for business writing and professional presentations in the English language.

From the University of New Mexico, he received his Masters in Linguistics and Doctorate in Linguistics with a Concentration in Speech & Hearing Sciences.

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
